

## Informed Consent Form – Mapping Access: Survey

Thank you for your interest in participating in the survey on campus accessibility at York University. This survey is part of the dissertation study, (tentatively) titled “An Ethics of Care in Response to Violence: An Arts-Based Collective”. This study draws from disability arts, research-creation, feminist and disability ethics of care, participatory action research, and theories in social justice education. It aims to theorize an ethics of care in response to violence, broadly defined as more than the perpetration of bodily harms and including systemic oppressions, discriminations, and exclusions that create barriers for people to access resources and safety. It focuses particularly on the injustices that take place in institutional systems.

This survey particularly locates York University campus as a site for examining the accessibility and barriers in the physical and learning environments. It invites participation from students, staff, and faculty. It aims to map out spaces where individuals’ access to care and resources may be supported or blocked, in order to imagine and strategize what it would take to increase the conditions of care for everyone who uses and relies on the facilities and systems.

Participation in this survey is entirely voluntary and anonymous. The results of the survey will be used in conjunction with other components of the dissertation study and may be published in reports that will be publicly accessible. The responses to the survey will be stored in a password protected Google Drive accessible only to the primary researcher and the research collaborators.
